Scholarships Now Available ...

• **U.S. Bank Internet Scholarship Program**

**Deadline:** October through February

**Amount:** \$1,000

**Eligibility:** No minimum GPA. Apply online at [usbank.com/studentbanking](http://usbank.com/studentbanking)

• **SunTrust Off To College Scholarship Sweepstakes**

**Deadline:** Winners every two weeks from October to May **Amount:** \$1,000

**Eligibility:** Open to high school seniors. Eligibility not based on GPA or financial need. Apply online at [offtocollege.info](http://offtocollege.info).

• **Coca-Cola Scholars**

**Deadline:** October 31, 2007

**Amount:** up to \$20,000

**Eligibility:** Applicants must be seniors who meet one of eight citizenship categories. Applicants are evaluated on: demonstrated leadership in school, commitment to community, academic achievement, and part-time employment. • **Prudential Spirit of Community Award**

**Deadline:** October 31, 2007

**Amount:** \$1,000 plus trip

**Eligibility:** Students in grades 5-12 who are legal residents of the U.S., Student must have engaged in a volunteer activity that occurred at least in part after September 1, 2006. Need to complete an online application and submit it to a school principal or head of other organizations as specified in brochure (see College and Career Center) by October 31, 2007. • **Scripps New Generation Scholarship**

**Deadline:** November 1, 2007

**Amount:** Full tuition plus other benefits

**Eligibility:** Seeking students holding weighted GPA's well over 4.0 and SAT scores (reading and math) in excess of 1400. Students should be involved contributors. This award is designed primarily to award and attract students of significant intellectual caliber with distinguished academic credentials.

• **Ron Brown Scholar Program**

**Deadline:** November 1, 2007 (early); January 9, 2008 (final) **Amount:** \$10,000 (renewable)

**Eligibility:** Open to African American high school seniors who are U.S. citizens or permanent residents and who demonstrate academic achievement, exhibit leadership ability, participate in community service activities and demonstrate financial need. Students who apply by **November 1<sup>st</sup>** will be considered for the Ron Brown Scholar Program, and also have their application information forwarded to a select and limited number of additional scholarship providers. Note: Students are still responsible for applying to all scholarship programs in which they are interested. Final deadline to apply is January 9, 2007. • **Daughters of the American Revolution Good Citizens Program**

**Deadline:** November 5, 2007

**Amount:** \$250

**Eligibility:** Open to students in 12<sup>th</sup> grade. Student must have the qualities of dependability, service, leadership and patriotism.

• **Daughters of the American Revolution Christopher Columbus Essay Contest**

**Deadline:** November 20, 2007

**Amount:** Not specified

**Eligibility:** Open to students in grades 9-12. • **California State PTA Scholarships**

**Deadline:** November 15, 2007

**Amount:** Not specified

**Eligibility:** Open to High school seniors. This scholarship recognizes volunteer service in the school and community and does not have a GPA restriction or requirement. Applicant must be a Calif. Resident, graduating from a high school in California with a PTA/PTSA unit in good standing and must be a member of his/her high school PTA/PTSA. A copy of applicant’s current PTA/PTSA membership card must be submitted with application. Application (including two reference forms) may be obtained from the Calif. **Deadline:** December 15, 2007

**Amount:** Up to \$15,000 plus other benefits

**Eligibility:** Open to high school seniors or college freshmen. Student can be in a community college or technical school and who plans to transfer to an NAAB-accredited program in the fall of 2008. Students entering a professional degree program leading to a Bachelor or Master of Architecture. Must be nominated by an individual who can support your interest and aptitude to become an architect. **Amount:** Not specified

**Eligibility:** Academically talented youths in grades 6-10 as of January 2008. Students must meet at least one of the criteria listed: Identified as eligible for GATE (gifted and talented education) services at their school; or scored at least at the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile on a standardized achievement or aptitude test of mathematical or verbal reasoning ability. Subtest scores such as computation, logic, comprehension or spelling as well as total composite scores in reading, math, science, etc.
